DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Oversee Middle School (7th & 8th grade) small groups.
- **BUILD RELATIONSHIPS** with 7th & 8th graders and their parents.
- Recruit and pour into middle school volunteers and teachers.
- Plan and execute 4 middle school event a year.
- Preach approximately once every three weeks on Wednesday nights.
- Rotate weekly at FCA between teaching and planning engaging Ice Breakers.
- Attend weekly student ministry meeting to for short, mid and long-range strategic planning.
- Work under the supervision of the Student Pastor.
- Work with the Student Pastor, Student Pastor Assistant on planning, events, and mass communication with students and parents.
- Perform other duties as assigned
- Coordinate with Student Pastor, Student Pastor Assistant, Middle School Resident and High School Resident on Student Ministry agendas.

ROUTE 56 INVOLVEMENT

- Offer connection not direction in Route 56, assist the Children's Pastor as needed in Route 56.
- Host events 2nd semester that are optional for the 6th graders to attend to assimilate them in the Youth Group early. (Year 1 = Camp to 6th Graders, evaluate after, possibly add more events that 6th Graders could attend)
- Actively engage kids in the Route 56 Ministry to transition them into Middle School.
- Attend Route 56 Trips, spend time in kids Large Group on Sunday Mornings.
- To slowly bridge the gap of students rising into Middle School.

WEDNESDAY YOUTH GROUP (5:00-7:30PM)

- Organize Middle School Care Groups
- Responsible for Middle School Attendance
- Responsible for all Middle School Guest Registration and assimilation into Care Groups and Small Groups

SUNDAY SMALL GROUPS

- Responsible for Middle School Attendance
- Responsible for communicating upcoming events to Middle School Students in Small Groups
- Responsible for all Guest Registration and assimilation into Middle School Care Groups
- Responsible for managing the following: small group teaching materials, videos, teachers and replacing teachers who are absent.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- To be present at Youth Events/Trips outside of Wednesdays and Sundays to help with organization and assist the Student Pastor.
- To be eyes and ears in our community specifically with the needs of Students and their families. To bring these needs and opportunities to serve to the Student Pastor, Small Group Leaders and Care Groups.
- To organize and execute 2-4 service projects that are carried out by Care Groups a year. These service projects should not only help our community but they should build community within our Students and Leaders.
